

Theta Chi 150th Anniversary Convention

This past summer was Theta Chi's 150th Anniversary Convention. For this special occasion, we went back to where our fraternity was founded; Norwich University in Vermont. Phi Chapter sent 10 members to the convention, and 2 Phi alumnus brothers were present, as well.

The business portion of the Convention consisted of electing and re-electing members of the Grand Chapter, legislation regarding Alcohol Free Housing, and a committee was set



up to explore the possibility of adding an undergraduate member to the Grand Chapter.

Unlike most summer conventions, there were not many breakout educational sessions this year. The 150th was largely a celebration. In light of this, a skit involving Freeman and Chase deciding to found Theta Chi was performed, and the oldest known version of the Ritual



was demonstrated. One afternoon was spent visiting the town of Norwich and viewing a marker which shows the spot where the Old South Barracks used to stand. Over 400 people went through this museum in 2 days.

Several speakers gave presentations. Among these were Brother Bob Arnold, who shared some very interesting and inspiring stories, and Brother Nick Del Calzo, who shared with those in attendance the work he has done chronicling Congressional Medal of Honor winners. We also celebrated and remembered the life of Brother James Burt, who won the Congressional Medal of Honor.

The Convention was concluded with a formal banquet where awards were presented. Phi Chapter was recognized once again and received it's 8th Alter Award, which leads the Fraternity. Closing remarks were given by Jim Hardwick, Phi '87.

Chris Shauer has been appointed North Dakota State University Hettinger Research Extension Center director, according to Ken Grafton, North Dakota Agricultural Experiment Station director and NDSU College of Agriculture, Food Systems, and Natural Resources dean. Shauer replaces Tim Faller, who retired as director in February.

Shauer has been doing post-doctoral research at the Hettinger REC since 2003. He was the principal investigator for research evaluating supra-supplementation of selenium to finishing lambs, alternative forages for beef cattle backgrounding ration, alternative supplementation strategies for grazing cows and alternative uses of Conservation Reserve Program lands.

In addition, Shauer is responsible for research evaluating the selenium status of grazing bison, alternative lamb-finishing rations, dormant-season grazing on western rangeland and multispecies grazing on leafy spurge-infested rangelands. Shauer completed his undergraduate and master's degree at NDSU and his doctorate degree in animal science at Oregon State University.
