AGR Undergoes Complete Renovation

In recent months, our neighbors to the south have begun a massive renovation and expansion project. Alpha Gamma Rho decided that a renovation and expansion was needed to their house in order to keep current with fire codes and stay competitive with the rest of the Greek community recruitment, while providing modern facilities to its active members.

AFP raised \$1.75M to remodel the 80 year old building

through their "Second Century Campaign". Eighty percent of the funds will go to the renovation and expansion which will include an additional 2,900 sq. feet, air conditioning, interior work, a patio, and expanded study spaces. Eleven percent will be used to purchase additional parking space from neighboring properties and nine percent will be devoted to a scholarship fund. They have not seen a renovation in 38 years.

"By investing in our chapter's home and extending precious scholarship dollars to deserving students, we will invigorate the fraternity and position it strongly for continued service to NDSU students," said Gregg Halverson '71, Chairman of the Campaign.

Several Alumni joined the Active chapter along with University President Joseph Chapman in breaking ground on the project on October 4th, 2009. The groundbreaking ceremony was covered by local news channels.

Farmhouse Builds New House

The men of FarmHouse Fraternity have been enjoying their first semester in a brand new building. FarmHouse finished up construction just as the fall semester began. The original building, nearly 100 years old, along with 2 neighboring houses belonging to an alumnus, were demolished to make room for the \$1.6 million building.

The new building has 3 stories and a basement that has room to accommodate 50 occupants. The previous building held only 36 members. The new house features a living area for



the house mother, a computer cluster, an expanded kitchen, large lawn, and enough parking for every member. The new FarmHouse building is just one part of the rapidly developing community along 12th Avenue. Several new businesses, classrooms, and apartments have been recently built in the surrounding areas. Access to the new businesses and establishments has been previously hampered by the 12th avenue road and bridge

expansion, which finished work late in the semester.

CAMPUS UPDATES

New Business Building

New to the NDSU Downtown Campus this year, Barry Hall has become the new home of the College of Business and Departments of Agribusiness and Applied Economics. Located at 811 2nd Ave. N., Richard H. Barry Hall is available for public lectures, conferences, research seminars and career development events, for current and future business professionals to connect.

The 135,000 square foot building opened its doors on August 24th, 2009 to more than 4000 students, staff and faculty. This state-of-the-art facility features 12 conference rooms, 131 offices, study areas on all six floors, coffee bar, and fully operational branches of the NDSU Bookstore and Library. Students can enjoy the amenities of the downtown area, including the new Cityscapes Apartment complex, which caters to students.





Minard Hall Collapse

During the early morning hours of Dec. 27, 2009 a section of the northwest portion of Minard Hall collapsed. No injuries were sustained and there was no one present in the affected area at the time of the incident. The collapse was due in part to excavation work in the immediate vicinity being done for the \$18 million Minard Renovation.


President Chapman Leaves NDSU The Presidential Search

Committee is still looking for a replacement for the recently resigned President Chapman. President Joseph A. Chapman's resignation from his position was to be effective January 2nd but he was replaced by interim President Richard Hanson on October 23rd.

President Chapman's resignation comes after public scrutiny of recent financial troubles. Chapman was criticized for spending \$22,000 to charter a jet

Obama's inauguration. Also under hot debate was the price of the new President's house on campus which went one million dollars over budget.

Chapman's departure was met with mixed emotion. While some felt it appropriate he stepped down amid the controversy, others put on a campaign to change his mind. The "Don't Go, Joe" campaign was short lived and unfruitful, but it got students and staff to remember how much President Chapman did for the university in his 11 year tenure.

As President, Chapman made NDSU into one of the leading research institutions in the country while seeing record enrollments for ten consecutive years. The NDSU athletic program also owes in part their recent successes and transition Division I to Chapman. Chapman, now 67, plans to either do consulting work or write a book.

GREEK INITIATIVES

Being asked to write an article encompassing the many aspects of the NDSU Greek Life Initiatives and Action Plan may seem like an easy thing to ask. When I was first asked to write on this topic, I was not surprised since the subject comes up quite often from alumni and collegiate members

To start off, there is not magic answer of what is going on with the initiatives and for those of you saying to yourself, "What are these darn initiatives she is writing about" please check them out on our website

www.ndsu.edu/mu/programs/greek_life. Many of you will be surprised to learn there is more to the document then the substance-free housing initiative.



I have picked a few of the initiatives that seem to raise the most questions. So join me as we dissect some of our most discussed initiatives!



Initiative 2 – This initiative provides support from the university to the Greek chapters through a number of sources. It provides the Greek community with a full time funded Coordinator of Greek Life and a half time funded Graduate Assistant. A benefit that students receive is a private office space for Greek Life student use which includes: desks, computers, one laptop, private meeting space within the office, storage space, an operational budget, and a full color brochure that has been designed and printed to help promote Greek Life at NDSU

Initiative 3 –This initiative establishes a permanent Greek Life Advisory Board. I am happy to say that this board is up and running, most currently discussing community expansion.

The Greek Life Advisory Board is working closely with past IFC President Tony Clowe (Active Theta Chi) to determine a plan for fraternity expansion at NDSU. Early in spring 2009 the IFC voted to explore expansion and then voted in fall 2009 to support expansion. Please stay tuned as these discussions are reported in at every IFC and President's meetings so your chapters will have the most updated information.

Many have asked, why fraternity expansion and not sorority. This is a valid concern and given our amazing fall numbers in the sorority community we are taking every step to ensure that our sorority community is able to offer opportunities for all women who are interested. Most recently the women voted to raise their chapter totals from 55 to 65 per chapter, which is a great, move forward.

Initiative 6 – Substance Free Housing, probably our most popular initiative as most individuals tend to remember this one. For those who are just learning about the initiatives, this initiative states *"No alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs are permitted in common areas of chapter property at any time. Members who are*

21 years of age may consume alcohol in the privacy of their rooms with no more than three guests who are also of legal age, provided that all of the occupants of the room are 21 years of age or older."

Members are given the role of implementing this initiative in their chapter houses and are often challenged with the roles they must play in enforcing the policy with their peers. This is unfortunately the reason some of our chapters end up on a probationary status with the university because they are unable to hold their own members or guest accountable. One other area of concern is having our collegiate members enforce this policy when alumni members are around. To ensure that the members of our community are able to function as the top quality chapters that they are, we ask that our alumni members adhere to the policies that are required of the collegiate members during visits back to the chapter.

Initiative 7 – Release from University Housing relates to the agreement between Residence Life and Greek Life regarding the release of new members to live in our fraternity or sorority chapter houses. This initiative has been incredibly helpful for those chapters who are in good standing with the university and are able to fill their chapter housing positions. The Greek community at NDSU is incredibly lucky to have this relationship built and maintained as many other universities do now allow first year students to terminate their housing contracts to move into Greek housing. Strong efforts



have been made to ensure that students are academically successful and come into the chapters understanding that certain rules apply based on the agreement.

Obviously this was a brief overview of our most discussed initiatives. I invite you to contact me if you have any questions regarding your chapter or the overall Greek community at NDSU. We are working hard everyday to ensure that students at NDSU have the most positive Greek experience available and that they leave NDSU proud to say they are a member of their fraternity or sorority and they are proud to be a Bison. These two should go hand in hand and we look to you, the alumni to assist with this process in any way possible.

The Phi chapter of Theta Chi should be very proud of the current collegiate membership, many key leaders have been in place to lead the chapter to the successes they have seen recently and it is our hope that this type of leadership continues from the chapter. From an alumni perspective, you should be proud of your chapter and the great accomplishments they have achieved. They are a group of fraternity men and not the typical "frat boys" title that so many may throw around freely.
