Active Chapter President Update

Phi Chapter has had a tremendous semester, demonstrating excellence in numerous aspects of Fraternity Life. We hit the landmark milestone of 100 members this semester and have 7 men graduate in May. Our house, despite not being completely full due to a recent campus rule change, has been lively and active with brotherhood every night of the week. We have 29 members this Spring and have 34 signed up to live in the chapter house this Fall.

Members of Phi Chapter have made large strides with involvement on campus. Freshman Christopher Dick was recently elected as Student Body Vice President. We also have 2 members serving on the NDSU Student Senate. Organizational involvement has also been tremendous, with numerous Phi Chapter Actives being involved with honors societies like Order of Omega.

Our service efforts this spring have been tremendous, with numerous events serving organizations like North Dakota Veterans Affairs Hospital, Feed My Starving Children, Furniture Mission, and Seeds of Hope. As a Chapter, we have served over 1000 hours and made a tremendous impact on the community. We also held 2 fundraisers to raise money for the USO and YWCA of Cass/Clay County.

Academics have also been excellent. Our Scholarship Chairman has implemented multiple academic incentives and programs that have seen numerous successes this semester. One of which is Study Buddies, which pairs actives with one another to study and hold each other accountable academically. This has allowed the chapter to obtain a 3.457 GPA at midterms.

This Spring we had a monumental rush that led to the initiation of 17 new members. Our Marshal and Recruitment Chairman worked together to create a seamless transition from Rush to the Pledge Process. This allowed for our Pledges to learn the values and ideals of Theta Chi, leading them to be fine additions to the Active Chapter.

As this academic year concludes, the Executive Team has been energized by the successes we have had both as a chapter, and as men. Overall, Phi Chapter is going in a direction of success and we are excited to see what the new year has in store.

Spring Recruitment

The 2023-2024 school year was remarkably successful for our recruitment efforts. We initiated 57 new members: 40 in the fall, and 17 in the spring. These achievements made us the fraternity with the highest recruitment numbers for both semesters.

We had plenty of snow this spring, so we used it to our advantage. We began rush week with a fish fry outside the front of the house and provided house tours to Potential New Members (PNMs). On Tuesday, we grilled hundreds of hot dogs and drove over to the outdoor rink. This was apparently a lot of the pledges' favorite event. Wednesday, we rolled it back a few notches and went to the wellness center pool, a lot of the guys hung out in the hot tub. This event was great for socializing with pnm's who were unsure about Greek Life and what Theta Chi was all about. Thursday was a Game Tournament where we set up brackets for games and gave out trophies to the winner. We paired each active with a PNM they were familiar with and they got to bond over some Madden (football video game). Friday we held an invite only formal banquet in the basement of the house. We went all-out for this one. We had chicken, mashed potatoes, green beans, dessert, salad, garlic bread, you name-it. In order to win over the straggler PNM's that were just there for the free meal or to hang out for a few days, we had to put that extra work in to show that we can provide them with an experience.

Post-rush, our Marshall, Thomas Hjerpe took over for the 8-week pledge process. Over the next 8 weeks, Thomas taught them about the history and values of Theta Chi. We initiated 17 members who are already showing great potential within Phi Chapter.

The success of our spring recruitment can be attributed to the organization and support from former recruitment executives. Additionally, attending the national conference, Amplify Theta Chi, in Indianapolis, IN, provided invaluable insights. The speakers shared strategies on effective recruitment practices, event planning, enhancing chapter attitude, and engaging PNMs. The knowledge gained from this experience positively impacted our chapter's recruitment outlook, leading to higher attendance and greater commitment from active members.
