With the recent change of Scholarship Chairmen from a minor executive position to a major executive position there has been a lot of changes and innovation regarding the position. This year the Scholarship Chairmen, Dylan Stradling created a way for people to get excited about school and their grades. As the scholarship chairmen, it is his duty to promote a culture of putting academics first. In order to do that, he has created a scholarship competition in the format of fantasy football. Active members are drafted into one of six teams and as a team it is their goal to score as many points in a two week span as they can to defeat the opposing team. A team scores points by submitting their grade of either a C or higher on tests, quizzes, homework, and assignments. For example an A on a test is

worth 20 points, a B is 15 points, and so on. The winning team gets a variety of prizes that encourages them to participate including one month of no house jobs and a pizza party. Added alongside the prizes for the winning team, the active member who submits the most scholar ball points receives a \$50 gift card to a place of his choice. Scholar ball has proven a great way to get members excited about grades with a majority of the chapter participating. The competitive atmosphere encourages actives to focus and put more effort into their academics than they would without it.
