IT'S NOT TOO LATE To support the campaign!

Three hundred brothers have made a financial contribution towards the renovation of our historic chapter home. Over \$850,000 has been donated for the project so far and an additional \$450,000 is pledged, for a total greater than \$1,300,000. If you have not contributed to this great project; we urge you to consider a donation now. We would like to raise another \$175,000 to help ensure that we do not have to cut any planned improvements to the chapter house in order to stay within our financial means.

In early January the Housing Corporation made an agreement with Bell Bank to provide a construction loan. This loan is necessary to cover construction expenses beyond the amount donated so far. We have not drawn on the loan yet but will need to draw on it later this spring. Every donation made right now is very important because it lowers the amount that we must borrow to complete the project! The loan will be paid back as the pledged donations are received over the next 5 years. At Pig Banquet, project volunteers and donors to the PhiNow Campaign will be uniquely recognized.

GREETINGS FROM THE UNDERGRADUATES!

I hope that life is treating you all well and that an enthusiasm for Pig Banquet and Phi Chapter's centennial year is stirring within. Here is a quick Q & A to answer some of the questions you may have about what is happening with Phi Chapter.

Q1: How many active members are there? **A:** We currently have 66 active members.

Q2: What is the chapter G.P.A.? **A:** The chapter has an overall G.P.A. of 3.019.

Q3: How is brotherhood being fostered without a house?

A: As a chapter, we knew that not having a house would remove the central space where all actives could hang out, which is a prime way brotherhood in the chapter is created. However, to compensate for the temporary loss of the house, we increased the number of BBAs (brotherhood building activities) to about one a week. This creates a rotating location that all brothers can go to to see active members that they might not otherwise see. BBAs range from going to the new pool in the Wellness Center to Ultimate Frisbee. Many members have moved in with each other as well, so we aren't nearly as divided as it may seem.

Q4: What has been done with the renovation of the house?

A: Over the summer, brothers Gunnar Breyer, Nick DeLaPointe, Alec Halvorson, and Tony Kimlinger assisted Russ and Cory Loveless with housing renovations. Specific changes made include:

- Tearing down the old chimney
- Gutting the kitchen, cave, and coal bin
- Tearing down walls throughout the rest of the house
- Salvaging old bricks from the chimney
- Recent changes as of January 13th include:
- Removal of studs between rooms and replacement of some flooring to create the new room layouts
- Pouring of the foundation for the extension and preparation for the elevator
- Electrical work

Overall, things are moving along, and Tony Kimlinger said that the brothers who helped "had an absolute blast working on the house and uncovering all the old beers and bottle caps that were hidden in the walls." He said "it was an honor to be a part of welcoming the new house and

saying goodbye to the old one," and that "it was truly a once in a lifetime opportunity."

As the house's completion draws near, I hear more people wishing for it to be done now and ready for move-in. We can't wait to celebrate Phi Chapter's centennial year with all of you and with other brothers from the International Headquarters and surrounding areas. As president, I am excited for what this year promises to offer. Before the renovation, I heard many actives getting nervous of what it would mean for the chapter. However, I see it as a momentous event that cannot be passed up. It offers a wave of excitement and a reinvigorated passion for Theta Chi as well as benefits for recruitment.

RENOVATION ON TARGET AND ON TIME!

The required permits are complete and filed. Building plans are drawn. The north chimney and north fire escape are history. Interior walls have been stripped to the studs in some cases. The basement is sporting new floors, and just in case you were wondering, the incinerator and old furnace have been removed too. "We saved the door," reports Brad Westrum. "Thankfully we never lost anyone looking for the Theta Chi key."

Building plans have been created by past chapter president and architect Jeff Wrede '92. "Jeff has

given his time selflessly and generously to produce drawings, prepare proper permits, as well as driving up from the Minneapolis/St. Paul area to Fargo to meet with stakeholders in the project," said Cory Loveless. The plans were completed with input from several undergraduates and alumni.

"The undergraduates have been a great partner in this project," adds Brad Westrum. "They provided design input and elbow grease in demolition and some reconstruction. A special call-out to former president Michael Thordson, Ben Peterson, and Derek Hatzenbuhler."

Although the general layout will remain largely unchanged, living space improvements are planned. On the second and third floors, common areas for studying and socializing will be created. An addition on the north side of the building will house a fire-proof stairwell, office space, laundry facilities, an elevator and additional storage. The kitchen is expanding into the basement bedroom, and plans include adding a guest lavatory on that level. The main staircase is being removed from the main floor to the 4th floor. It will be relocated to the new fire-proof addition. A handicapped-accessible suite on the main floor will replace the current TV room and office. The main floor and red carpet will be refinished where necessary. All lead glass and stained glass windows are being preserved. Sprinklers are being installed throughout the facility to make the chapter house code compliant.

"All brothers will have an opportunity to take a 'Construction Hard-Hat Tour' of the house to step inside and get an idea of what the new spaces may feel like," said project volunteer Cory Loveless. "A big thanks to Russ Handegard and all of the people involved in this effort."
