Our philanthropy efforts have never been better. Our rose sale and tacos and tunes events had serious improvements from the year prior. We have raised more money in those two events than all events combined in the last year.

Last year we made scholarship chairman a major executive position and we are seeing the positive effects of doing so. Our grades are a large focus and our midterm GPA for this spring sits at 3.43. Different incentives and scholarship programs have allowed and motivated us to achieve this standing.
